

We All Benefit from Continuous Quality Improvement

We at the state level are working on Continuous Quality Improvement right alongside you. Just as you want to make your program as good as it possibly can be, we want to make sure that the statewide FOCUS quality improvement support system is responsive to your needs.



We have spent a lot of time talking with you about the current FOCUS training criteria – gathering feedback – and talking about changes that could be made.

THANK YOU – to all of you who took the time to document input regarding proposed changes to the FOCUS Criteria. At this time, we want to present changes that are being made IMMEDIATELY (effective Monday, November 23, 2015).

1) College Courses

<u>Any</u> of the courses leading to the New Mexico Child Development Certificate can be taken when a college course is required...the courses do not have to be taken in a prescribed order.

2) Six-Hour Courses

Either of the "six-hour courses" can be taken when a "six-hour course" is required.

3) Training Criteria/Requirements for NEW Educators

NEW EDUCATORS are only required to take the 45-Hour Entry Level Course and "Intro to Focus" during their first year of employment.

Educators who have already taken the 45-Hour Entry Level Course and have worked with children for at least six months are expected to take the FOCUS training as required.

4) The Orientation to Intentional Teaching Series, Introduction to Intentional Teaching series, Intermediate Intentional Teaching series, and Advanced Intentional Teaching series

The Orientation to Intentional Teaching Series, Introduction to Intentional Teaching series, Intermediate Intentional Teaching series, and Advanced Intentional Teaching series are no longer required. In collaboration with the FOCUS Consultant and individual educator, the Director is expected to observe each educator's strengths in the classroom, consider previous training, and determine training needs. A plan to learn about, implement, or review the Early Learning Guidelines, the NM Authentic Observation Documentation and Curriculum Planning Process, and Continuous Quality Improvement will be written into each educator's Professional Development Plan (PDP). This training is available if identified in the PDP.

Planning Time Grants

We also received feedback on the implementation and access to the Planning Time Grants for FOCUS participating programs. To support programs achieve their goals to improve quality, we have updated the requirements for program participation.

Effective immediately,

- 1. Planning Time Grants will pay for a team of "Floaters/substitutes" to release each team of Educators for 2 hours per week, per educator (so a team of two educators can get a total combined of four hours, a team of three would be six hours, etc.)
- 2. Based on available funding, planning grants are available on a first come first serve basis for STAR 2+,3, 4, 5 and 5 STAR State recognized accredited programs (programs are responsible for attaching the current Accreditation certificate to their application).
- 3. If there are more programs applying than funding available, a waiting list will be created, and the following priority criteria will be implemented as follows:
 - a. STAR 3, 4 and 5 FOCUS
 - b. State recognized accredited programs
 - c. Programs working on 2+criteria
